

Richard from Lander and Rogers (LAVic Legal Representatives) spoke about why this needs to be amended/restructured

Amend/Restructure Current LAVic Constitution (August 2012)

Replace with

Little Athletics Victoria Constitution Current Version (June 2014)

Reason:

On 26 November 2012, the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (and its associated Regulations) replaced the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.

Transitional arrangements to help associations adjust to the new laws were in place from 26 November 2012 to 25 November 2013. This transitional period has now ended.

The Associations needs to change their rules to incorporate 23 required matters if not already addressed as part of the new laws. These include:

- The Association's name and purposes
- Members' rights and obligations
- Procedures for resignation and cessation of membership
- The process for appointment and termination of the secretary
- Preparing and keeping minutes of general and committee meetings
- Enabling members to access minutes of general meetings, including financial statements submitted at a general meeting
- Members' right of access (if any is specified in the rules) to committee meeting minutes.

BOM Comment:

This is a necessity based on the new Associations Incorporation Reform Act to include the required items, however we have also utilised the opportunity to change some other items which have been discussed in previous years including;

- President, Finance, Education & Competition Roles remaining
- Floating Directors Roles for other positions to allow flexibility
- Other general editorial and required changes

Comments: Diamond Valley – Why does there have to be the removal of the 10% cap on fees

BOM response: It was taken out on the recommendation of legal advice and gives the opportunity to put fees up by more than 10% without having to go to an AGM, but it is not necessarily what will happen.

Motion was put to the floor and BOM called for a division. The motion was lost.

The President then explained to delegates that an extra-ordinary AGM would have to be called and an amended constitution would have to be voted on again.

Question – Diamond Valley asked if the motion could be put to the floor with an amendment on the fee increases.

As the motion had already been voted on it needed a full 100% vote to put the motion back on the floor. The vote was 100%.

The motion C14-01 was back on the floor with an amendment that the clause in the July 2012 Constitution - 7A – subscriptions and fees remain in the new constitution that will be dated August 2014

Reason:

The BOM has had a complete review of Championship events and how the fees and operations should be implemented moving forward.

The State Multi-Event Championships has an increase from \$15 to \$30, however after evaluating the event it was considered that the fee in comparison to other events was too cheap given the amount of events being conducted per age group.

After a discussion regarding extensive queues at the entry points given all athletes arrive at the same time and the need for better process, it was decided that gate fees would be discontinued and a complimentary program provided per family as part of the registration fee, hence the increase. There is also no car parking charges at this event.

The State Relay Championships fees have not increased for an extensive period of time and it was agreed that the fee should be increased to \$20 per team, still considered cheap when compared to individual entries for other events.

The State Track & Field entries were also considered and a minor adjustment of \$1 per event added to the registration fees based on forecasted event price rises in the future.

Given the registration data collected from last year's events where in excess of 50% of participants entered events after the early bird pricing had expired which lead to premium prices being paid it was considered acceptable and reasonable for the price increases.

Reason:

At present EMR receive \$35 from LAVic per attending athlete at each of our camps. Due to the continuing increase of costs for coaches to transport the athletes to the camps, IMG online registrations, accommodation, meals, and camp activities, we are requesting an increase of \$10 per athlete which would then make the subsidy from LAVic \$45. EMR are the only Region who offers camps for the U10 – U15 age groups. Over the past few years we have also had several athletes attend the camps from other Regions.

These camps cater for those athletes who wish to be coached in all athletic events (some Centres do not have enough qualified Coaches to cater for these athletes on a weekly basis). Many of the athletes who attend the camps do not qualify for the JDS Squad and are unable to attend the U11 Skills Clinic.

There has been no increase in the camp subsidy from LAVic for several years, we seek support from all Centres when voting for this motion.

BOM Comment:

As per previous requests to change this motion at both the 2011 and 2012 AGM, the BOM has not changed its position on the subsidy increase. Whilst the camp subsidy has not changed recently the costs to the Association this year were \$4550 and in excess of \$6000 in previous years.

It is the BOM's suggestion that EMR raises the costs to cover extra charges as a \$45 subsidy deducted from the \$63 registration fee leaves little or no revenue for that child not including any insurance, administration or other programs. The JDS camp receives no subsidy and is currently self-funding based on participation fees.

If this motion is successful, delegates are reminded that the Association will need to cover the costs in some manner and generally this is via our major source of income being registration fee increases in the future.
