House Rules

Important Standing Rules

Any member desiring to speak must attract the attention of the Chair by rising in their seat, or raising the Centre board. When called upon they must identify themselves to the Chair. If two or more members indicate simultaneously, the Chair will call upon the member who first caught his/her eye.

The Chair will, as far as practicable, call on speakers for and against a motion or amendment alternatively, subject to the right of the seconder to speak immediately after the mover. If two consecutive speakers have both argued for or against a motion or an amendment, and there is no member wishing to argue the opposite view, or, in the case of a motion, to move an amendment, the motion or the amendment shall, subject, in the case of a motion, to the mover's right of reply or the seconder's right of reserve, be put without further debate unless otherwise determined by the meeting.

- A member moving a motion or amendment will be deemed to have spoken to it. A member seconding a motion or amendment without speaking to it may reserve the right to speak to it subsequently.
- After a motion has been duly moved and seconded speakers will only be heard alternately for and against the motion excepting for the purpose of moving or seconding any amendment or further amendment and failing any speaker rising for the other side the motion will be put unless otherwise determined by the meeting.
- ➤ Points of Order do not require a seconder and may be called at any time during debate and, are matters on which the Chair must decide.
- Personal Questions can be moved by a member, although the Chair has the option of accepting or rejecting the question which may be to the Chair or any other member.
- Any member may move the suspension of Standing Orders to discuss a matter of urgency or more fully discuss a matter without the formalities of debate to the meeting. Such motion of suspension will be declared carried if supported by twothirds of the members present.

James required delegates to number the pages of the financial report from 1 through to page 17. This was to enable delegates to follow James verbal report of the financial statements. James went through his report and then asked for questions.

Mornington asked if the financial statements included all the region financial statements, James replied no. Mornington then requested to raise a point of order as rule 20.3 under the constitution states "for the purposes of administering Members and conducting competition, the Association shall be formed into Regions that are created by an instrument of the Board." As such every region is a part of the association and if their statements are not part of the association accounts then the members do not get to see the "true" financial statements of the association.

James responded that the financial report is a true reflection of Little Athletics Victoria Incorporated financials. Centres and Regions have their own bank accounts and Annual General Meetings of which their financial statements are presented. Region Financial Statements have never been included in the Little Athletics Victoria AGM.

Mornington stated under the incorporations act the association must keep records that show a true and fair view of the whole association. The Regions are an instrument of the Board so are part of the Association, they are a delegation of authority for the board, so if the members sign off on the financial statements without the regions financials being included then the association is in breach of the incorporations act.

After further input from Collingwood and James on the same issue, Steve thanked the delegates from Mornington and Collingwood and asked for the meeting to be adjourned for a few minutes so the Board could have a brief discussion on the issue.

Adjourned at 11:45am

The Meeting resumed at: 11:55am

James spoke that the Board of Management has taken on board the comments of the delegates but the financial statements are a true and accurate account of Little Athletics Victoria.

James explained the implications of not adopting the financial statements today and the process that would have to be followed if the members believed that the region financial statements have to be included as part of Little Athletics Victoria financial statements.

Mornington apologized to be raising this issue at the meeting today as they had already raised this at the SMR meeting back in June. Mornington then re-iterated that under the incorporations act the financial statements from the regions needed to be included for the members to sign off on the Little Athletics Victoria financial statements.

Paul Bray and Collingwood then both spoke on the issue.

Steve Ryan then spoke and declared that the financial statements would be presented to the floor for delegates to vote on.

A motion was moved by Collingwood that the chairs decision be dissented from.

Moved Collingwood Seconded Coburg

Steve Ryan referred to the standing orders for the new delegates so everyone understood what a dissent was.

Paul Bray then resided in the chair.

Collingwood went through the reason why they moved a motion to dissent the chairs decision.

Paul then put the motion that the chairs ruling was dissented from. Green cards are to be used for voting. An explanation was asked for and Paul explained to the Centre delegates that they were voting for the motion that was put forward by Collingwood. After counting the votes, which required a division to get an accurate count. 69 in favour and 58 against. The motion was carried.

Steve Ryan then resumed the chair.

The dissent was excepted so the Annual General Meeting was adjourned so the Board could seek legal advice. Steve then closed the meeting.
